Admission

To enter Kindergarten, a child must be 5 years old on or before September 30 of the enrollment year. To enter first grade, a child must be 6 years old on or before September 30 of the enrollment year or have successfully completed one full year of public school kindergarten, and their parents or legal guardian must live within the School District. Students are eligible to enroll in grades 2-12 if their parents or legal guardian live in the school district; unless they have not passed their 21st birthday; and they have not been granted a high school diploma.
